THE RE-DEDICATION OF ENGLAND AS THE DOWRY OF MARY

Marian Shrine of Incarnation

*When England returns to Walsingham,
Our Lady will return to England*

These prophetic words of Pope Leo XIII seem to indicate that Walsingham is intimately associated with the spiritual health of England.

Mary was the first disciple, who has guided and inspired the Church since the beginning. She was the one who accompanied her Son from the moment of his conception at the Annunciation to his death and Resurrection and was present at the birth of the Church at Pentecost. This was the cause of Mary's joy, that she witnessed the events of the life of her Son. The establishment of the shrine of Our Lady at Walsingham arose out of the devotion of the Lady Richeldis, who had a great desire to honour the Mother of God. Walsingham is certainly not the oldest Marian shrine in England, but it is the place where Our Lady made herself known in spirit and asked for the replica of the Holy House of Nazareth to be built so that 'all could share in the joy of my Annunciation'. The fruits of this manifestation of the Holy Spirit brought joy, comfort and hope to all who came and continue to come on pilgrimage:

*O England, you have great cause to be glad
For you are compared to the Promised Land, Zion
You are called in every realm
and region*

The Holy Land, Our Lady's Dowry.

In you is built new Nazareth,

A house to the honour of the Queen of Heaven

And her most glorious Salutation

When Gabriel said at Old Nazareth, Ave,

This same joy shall here be daily and forever remembered.

Re-dedication timetable

- **Feb 21st 2020.** All Catholics, and anybody else who wants to join in, will be invited to begin a personal 33 day consecration to Jesus through Mary following the method of St Louis de Montfort. Free books will be sent from the shrine, on request, written by Fr Michael Gaitley entitled, '33 days to morning glory'. Alternatively, the book can be followed on a daily basis on Youtube: type "33 Days to Morning Glory" in the search box.
- **March 25th, Wednesday, the Feast of the Annunciation.** All who are following the consecration will consecrate themselves to Jesus through Mary on this day.
- **Thursday 26th, Friday 27th, Saturday 28th, a three-day triduum of prayer** in which all will be invited to recite the litany of Saints and Martyrs of England and pray the rosary in preparation for the rededication.
- **Sunday March 29th, a personal rededication** as the dowry of Mary. This will be done in Westminster, Walsingham, every Cathedral, every cooperating parish, and as many homes as possible. It is a personal rededication following the guidelines in the book 'The Angelus Promise' which can be obtained from the Shrine.

If you are going into hospital or know someone who has gone into hospital....

It is appropriate to receive the Sacraments when in hospital:



- There is a **chaplains team** responsible for the pastoral and sacramental care of Catholics (Similarly ministers of other religions to provide appropriate spiritual care for members of those religions).
- However, the chaplains team are **not** automatically informed of those who would like to receive such spiritual care.
- If you wish to receive Sacramental and spiritual care when in hospital, or if you have a relative who has been taken into hospital and would like to receive Sacramental and spiritual care, then it is your responsibility to communicate this information to the hospital chaplaincy (please give the name of the patient, and the ward number/name).
- You can **contact the chaplaincy** either by phone or e-mail, using the Chaplaincy contact details which are always on this newsletter.
- If you do not contact the chaplaincy with this information, then the Chaplaincy will not know of your/your relative's stay in hospital, and it will not be their fault that they have not visited you/your relative.
- It is illegal (due to Data Protection legislation) for the Chaplaincy to pass on information concerning hospital patients to Parish Priests.
